

On this occasion Elocution and Extempore Speech on Daily Usage Items Competitions were held among students of ICFAI University. Nearly 30 students participated in the competitions.







Report on Gender Sensitization: Society, Culture, and Change



From 30/08/24to 03/09/24the Faculty of Management and Commerce at ICFAI University Tripura hosted a pivotal session titled "Gender Sensitization: Society, Culture, and Change" aimed at first-year BBA students. This event was meticulously organized to address crucial issues surrounding gender, harassment, and the societal impacts of these issues, fostering a deeper understanding and encouraging progressive attitudes among the students. The session was designed with a clear objective: to enlighten students about gender issues and the significant consequences of harassment, thereby promoting a more respectful and inclusive environment. It sought to achieve the following:

- To provide students with a thorough understanding of gender sensitization, including the nuances of gender identity, roles, and equality.
- To spotlight the prevalence of gender-based harassment and its profound effects on individuals and society.
- To inspire students to adopt inclusive attitudes and behaviors that transcend traditional gender norms.
- To equip students with practical advice on addressing and reporting instances of harassment or discrimination.

The session commenced with a brief introduction, where the organizers articulated the purpose of the event and outlined the agenda. The lecture began with a foundational overview of gender sensitization, defining it as the process of fostering awareness and understanding of gender issues. The speaker explained key concepts such as gender identity, which refers to an individual's internal sense of their gender, and gender roles, which are societal expectations based on one's gender. The influence of cultural practices and societal expectations on gender perceptions was examined, revealing how deeply ingrained biases can affect personal interactions and institutional policies. The session emphasized that understanding these cultural dimensions is crucial for addressing and transforming gender-based inequalities. The latter part of the session addressed the critical issue of harassment. The speaker detailed various forms of harassment, including sexual harassment, workplace harassment, and bullying, and discussed their repercussions on victims. The emphasis was on the psychological, emotional, and professional impacts that harassment can have on individuals. By presenting real-life scenarios and case studies, the session illustrated the far-reaching consequences of harassment and the importance of creating safe environments for everyone. To ensure active participation and engagement, the session included interactive elements such as Q&A sessions, group discussions, and role-playing exercises. These activities allowed students to reflect on their own experiences, discuss potential solutions, and develop a greater empathy for those affected by gender-related issues.

The session concluded with a summary of key takeaways and an invitation for students to engage in further learning and advocacy. Resource materials and contact information for support services were provided to empower students with tools and knowledge to address gender issues proactively. Overall, the "Gender Sensitization: Society, Culture, and Change" at ICFAI University Tripura. By addressing gender issues comprehensively, the event aimed more inclusive society.
