Objective of the Programme

The Faculty of Law, in collaboration with the Career Development Center, organized an Online Career Counseling Session titled **"Beyond the Classroom: The Complete Roadmap to a Successful Legal Career"** to bridge the gap between legal education and the professional requirements of the legal industry. The programme aimed to acquaint students with practical legal skills, career opportunities, professional ethics, and industry expectations, thereby facilitating a smooth transition from law school to legal practice.

Programme Proceedings

The session commenced with **Mr. Arnab Chakraborty, Development Officer, Career Development Center**, welcoming the distinguished resource person, faculty members, and participating students. He highlighted the significance of career counseling initiatives in preparing students for the dynamic legal profession and encouraged participants to make the most of the interaction.

The **Welcome Address** was delivered by **Dr. Nabarun Bhattacharjee, Principal, Faculty of Law**. In his address, he emphasized that while **theoretical knowledge forms the foundation of legal education, practical skills are acquired through continuous engagement with the professional and industry experts**. He observed that the legal curriculum can be significantly enriched through collaborations with experienced practitioners, enabling students to understand the realities of legal practice. He further remarked that **a degree in law is a professional qualification that demands discipline, skill development, ethical conduct, and lifelong learning**, all of which are indispensable for becoming a successful legal professional.

The keynote session was delivered by **Mr. Madhav Goswami, Advocate & Legal Consultant and Legal Advisor, Mobile Programming India Pvt. Ltd., Delhi NCR**. He explained that **theory and practical experience complement one another**, and therefore legal education should reflect the current realities and evolving expectations of the legal industry. He candidly discussed how many graduates experienced difficulties while transitioning from the classroom to the profession because they are insufficiently prepared with practical competencies.

Mr. Goswami addressed several misconceptions commonly held by law students, particularly the belief that **earning a law degree alone is sufficient for professional success**. He stressed that employers seek graduates who can demonstrate competence in legal research, drafting, negotiation, communication, commercial awareness, ethics, and professional judgment rather than merely possessing academic qualifications.

The resource person elaborated upon the **seven essential competencies** required for a successful legal career, namely effective communication, legal research, drafting, commercial awareness, professional ethics, technological proficiency including the responsible use of Artificial Intelligence, and continuous learning. He also discussed diverse career avenues available to law graduates, including litigation, corporate practice, judiciary, alternative dispute resolution, academia, public policy, and legal research, encouraging students to select career paths aligned with their interests, strengths, and long-term aspirations rather than immediate financial considerations.

Further, he advised students to prioritize **meaningful internships, participation in moot courts and legal aid clinics, mentorship, networking, and practical skill development** over the mere accumulation of certificates. He underscored that professionalism, resilience; consistency, punctuality, and ethical conduct constitute the foundation of a sustainable legal career. The session concluded with practical recommendations encouraging students to identify one legal skill to improve, seek regular mentorship, embrace technology responsibly, and commit them to continuous professional growth.

The deliberation was followed by an engaging **Question and Answer Session**, during which students actively interacted with the resource person and sought guidance regarding internships, career planning, skill enhancement, and professional opportunities. The programme concluded with a **Vote of Thanks** delivered by **Dr. Raghunath Chakraborty, Assistant Professor**,

Faculty of Law, expressing gratitude to the resource person, university administration, faculty members, Career Development Center, and participating students for making the event successful.

- Develop an understanding of the growing role of technology and Artificial Intelligence in legal practice.

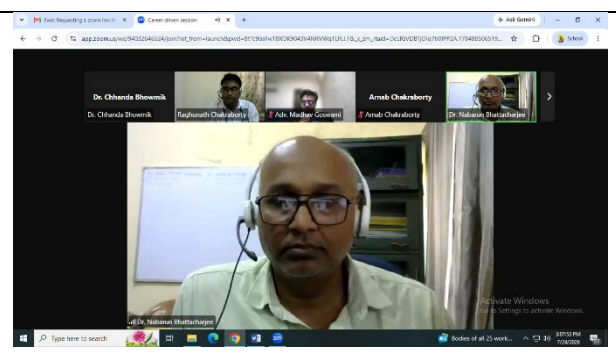
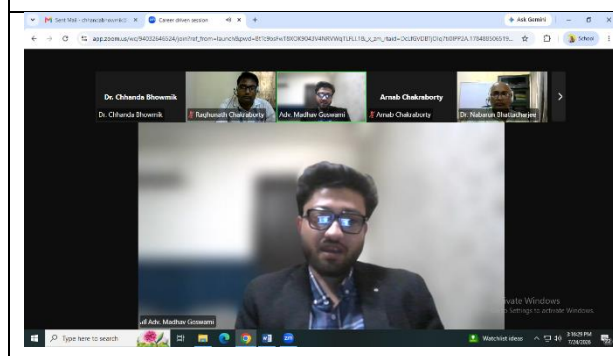
Impact of the Programme

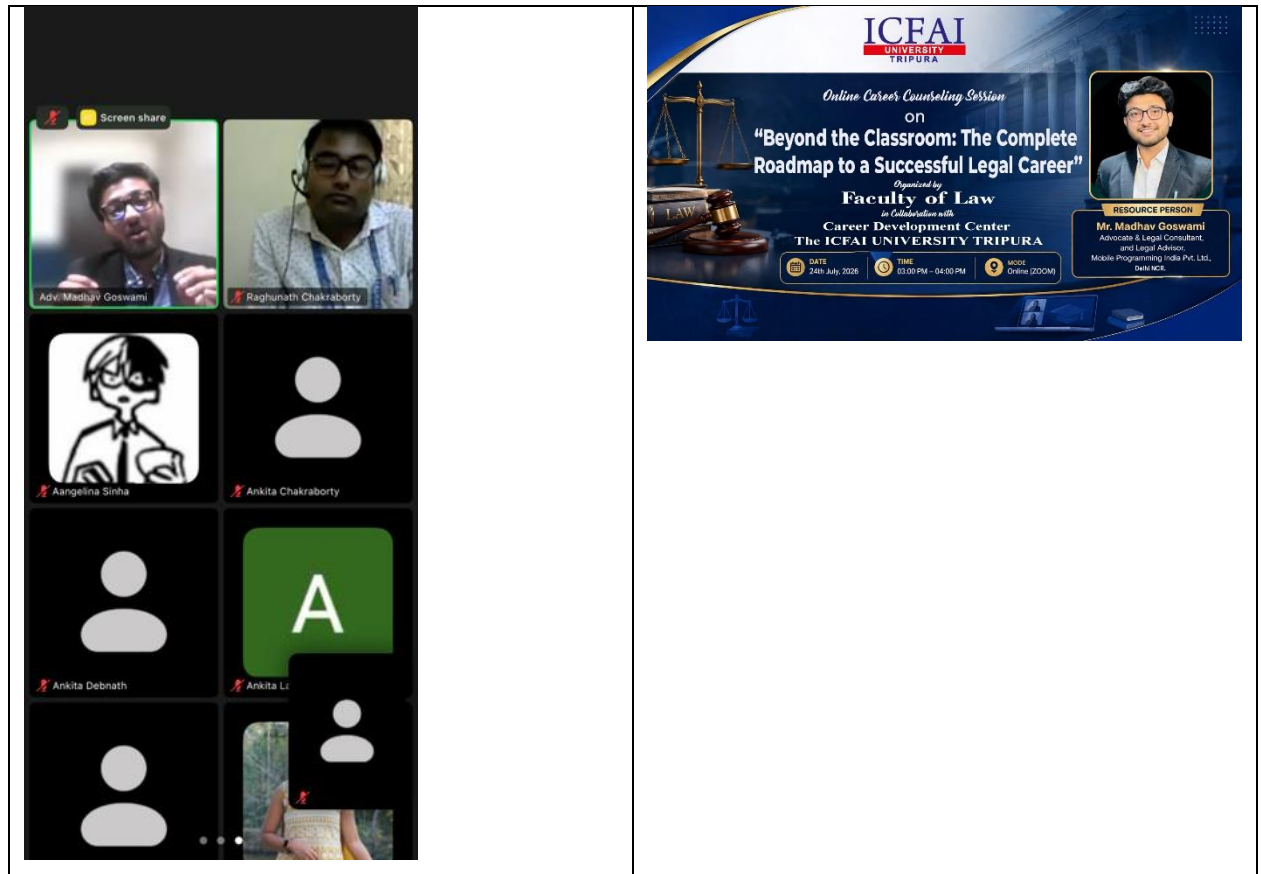
