○ Day 1:

Dr. Asish De very vividly discussed about the concept of Idea and differentiated between the notion of idea and concept. He also defined idea as mental construct and clarified the perception of transforming ideas into research. Dr. Dey also explained the real methodology of discerning nomenclature, literature review and analysis of data in a research work.

Dr. Sangita Laha very vibrantly conversed the concept of research ethics by highlighting the importance of honesty, objectivity, integrity, carefulness and confidentiality in a research.

○ Day 2:

Dr. K. Mahalaxmi in her session taught us about the journal finding tools. She also emphasised on the technique to identify fake journals and clarified the idea of role of high-quality journals in a research.

○ Day 3:

Dr.Sridipa Sinha discussed about the reasons behind literature review and suggested to plan the research work in such a way that it can provide the reader an overall framework and can give a judicious rationale to study.

Dr.Thangaraja Arumugam also taught us about the advanced sampling technique and research tools for research methodology by giving emphasis on the sampling frame, sampling unit and other sampling techniques.

Dr. Manoj Kanti Debnath explored the designs used in research and data analysis. Sir practically demonstrated the data analysis methods on software's like SPSS and R software.

Dr. Indranil Majumder started the session by pointing out the Ph.D scenario in India and motivated about the way to keep balance between course work and beginning of real research. Thus he has shared various concepts of starting an effective research.

Dr.Swapan Raha addressed the research aspirants by sharing his knowledge on the experimental methods of research applicable for basic science. Sir also put special emphasis on the interpretation of approximate reasoning and the logic behind such reasoning.

Dr. Debatosh Bhattacharjee discussed about the significance of publication and research in thesis. According to him publishing a research paper can have many advantages for researchers, including: Career advancement, professional recognition, opportunities for collaboration, increased visibility, impact on society, credibility etc.

○ Day 4:

Dr. Tarak Pan successfully taught about the statistical techniques in research.

Dr. Anurag Chauhan trained the researchers on several approaches to the text and the tools and methods of textual analysis for good results in research.

Dr. Sandeep Sitaram Ghugre very thoroughly discussed how to start an effective experimental research by highlighting specially on various collaborative research schemes.

Dr. Raghu Echempati sir incredibly discussed about the objective and goal of Research Methodology in Science & Technology. Sir also explained how research and development activities contribute to improving innovation, and technology transfer, ultimately enhancing the quality of researchers.

Dr. Dipayan Chattopadhyay discussed how to incorporate AI and Machine Learning into research endeavours and also gave special prominence to various categorization of machine learning.

Dr. Prasenjit Bal explained the numerous advantages of using LaTeX for thesis writing and also gave valuable insights how LaTeX can streamline the writing process and can meet rigorous academic standards.

○ Day 5:

Dr. Allesandro Vescovi instructed us on how to successfully transform a doctoral dissertation into a monograph. Additionally, Sir talked on the best assessment strategy.

Dr. Vijayakumar Mallappa amazingly discussed about the grasp of plagiarism which need to be detected and avoided as it is becoming a dangerous tool to bridge the gap in academics. It is demotivating the in spirants from doing authentic research. Sir also gave a vast knowledge about appropriate Citations and AI tools.

Detail Report of the Sessions:

Day 1: Common Session

Dr. Asis De, Associate Professor & Director of Research, Humanities and Social Sciences, Mahishadal, Raj College, West Bengal; (3.00 PM - 4.00PM). He commenced by highlighting the importance of balancing course work with real research in the Ph.D. scenario in India. He emphasized the significance of starting an effective research, outlining various concepts to achieve this. He differentiated between idea and concept, defining idea as a mental construct and clarifying the process of transforming ideas into research. He also elaborated on the methodology of discerning nomenclature, literature review, and data analysis in a research work, providing a comprehensive understanding of the research process. His insights helped students grasp the fundamental principles of research, setting them on the right path for their Ph.D. journey.

Dr. Sangita Laha, Associate Professor & Assistant Registrar - (I/C), National University of Study and Research in Law, Ranchi, (4:10PM-5:10PM). The speaker emphasized the significance of research ethics, stressing the importance of honesty, objectivity, integrity, carefulness, and confidentiality. He highlighted that honesty is crucial in reporting results, objectivity is essential in analyzing data, and integrity is vital in maintaining transparency throughout the research process.

Day 2: Common Session

Dr. K. Mahalaxmi, Assistant Librarian of Avinashilingam Institute for Home Science and Higher Education for Women, Coimbatore; (3.00 PM - 4.30PM). Began by highlighting the crucial aspect of journal selection in research, emphasizing the importance of finding reliable and reputable journals. He introduced various tools such as Google Scholar, Scopus, and Web of Science to identify high-impact journals. He also discussed the concept of predatory journals, defining characteristics such as poor peer-review processes, high publication fees, and lack of transparency. The session covered the significance of DOAJ (Directory of Open Access Journals) and Clarivate Analytics in identifying legitimate journals. Additionally, she warned about fake impact factors and the importance of verifying a journal's credibility before submission.

Day 3: Common session/Parallel Sessions of Social Science, Basic Science, Technical School

Dr.Sridipa Sinha, Professor, University of Calcutta, West Bengal; (2:00PM-2:50PM). Emphasized the significance of conducting a thorough literature review in research, highlighting its role in identifying knowledge gaps and providing a foundation for the study. He advised planning the research framework to facilitate the reader's understanding and to establish a sound rationale for the investigation. By doing so, the researcher can demonstrate a clear understanding of the existing knowledge in the field and justify their contribution to it. This approach enables the reader to comprehend the study's relevance, scope, and limitations, ultimately enhancing the research's credibility and impact.

Dr.Thangaraja Arumugam, Assistant Professor, Business School, Vellore Institute of Technology, Chennai; (3:00PM-4:00PM). In the course, we delved into the realm of research methodology, focusing on the importance of sampling techniques in research design. We explored the concept of a sampling frame, sampling unit, and various traditional sampling methods such as simple random sampling, stratified random sampling, and cluster sampling. Additionally, we discussed advanced sampling techniques like systematic sampling, multistage sampling, and snowball sampling. We also learned about power analysis and effect size, crucial elements in determining the sample size and significance of research findings. These concepts equipped us with a solid understanding of how to design and execute effective research studies.

Dr. Manoj Kanti Debnath, Assistant Prof., Department of Agricultural Statistics, Uttar Banga Krishi Viswavidyalaya, Pundibari, West Bengal; (4.10 PM - 5.10PM). During the session, the instructor explored various designs used in research and data analysis, providing a comprehensive overview of the concepts and techniques. He demonstrated practical applications of these designs on software platforms like SPSS and R, making complex concepts more accessible to the audience. The instructor's hands-on approach allowed participants to see the data analysis methods in action, facilitating a deeper understanding of statistical modeling, data visualization, and interpretation. Through interactive exercises and examples, participants gained hands-on experience with SPSS and R, enabling them to apply these skills to their own research projects.

Dr. Indranil Majumder, Senior Professor, Dept. of Nuclear & Atomic Physics, Dean, Infrastructure, Tata Institute of Fundamental Research, Colaba, Mumbai. (3.00 PM - 4.00PM). Began by highlighting the significance of balancing coursework with research in the Indian

Ph.D. scenario. He emphasized the importance of striking a balance between mastering course material and initiating original research. He shared insightful concepts on starting an effective research, including identifying a research problem, setting specific goals, and developing a structured approach. He also stressed the importance of reading widely, attending seminars and workshops, and collaborating with peers to stay updated on the latest developments in the field. By emphasizing these key aspects, Dr. [Name] provided valuable guidance for Ph.D. students to successfully navigate their academic journey and achieve their research objectives.

Dr.Swapan Raha, Department of Mathematics Siksha Bhavana (Institute of Science) VisvaBharati Santiniketan, Birbhum, WB; **(4:10PM-5:10PM)**. Commenced the session by emphasizing the importance of striking a balance between course work and research in the PhD program. He stressed that it's essential to start with a clear understanding of the research topic and its objectives, and then gradually delve into the literature review. He highlighted the significance of identifying a specific research gap and formulating a research question that can be addressed through experimentation. He also emphasized the importance of adopting an experimental method that is relevant to the research area, such as randomized controlled trials or case studies. Additionally, he cautioned against overemphasis on statistical analysis, encouraging students to interpret their findings with caution and consider the limitations of their study.

Dr.Debatosh Bhattacharjee, Department of Computer Science and Engineering, Jadavpur University, WB; **(3:00PM-4:00PM)**. He underscored the importance of publication and research in a thesis, citing numerous benefits for researchers. Publishing a research paper can lead to career advancement, professional recognition, and opportunities for collaboration. It also increases visibility, allowing researchers to share their findings with a broader audience, ultimately having a positive impact on society. Additionally, publication enhances credibility and reputation, opening doors for future research opportunities and funding. He emphasized that publishing research is essential for establishing oneself as an expert in the field and making a lasting contribution to the scientific community.

Day 4: Parallel Session so Social Science/Basic Science/Technical School

Dr. Tarak Nath Pan, Emeritus Professor, The ICFAI University Tripura; **(3:00PM-4:00PM)**. He successfully taught various statistical techniques to the research students, including hypothesis testing, regression analysis, and ANOVA. He used real-life examples and

interactive exercises to help students understand the concepts, making them more confident in their ability to apply statistical methods in their own research projects.

Dr. Anurag Chauhan, Professor of English Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya, Bilaspur; **(4:10PM-5:10PM)**, trained the researchers on various approaches to textual analysis, including content analysis, thematic analysis, and discourse analysis. He demonstrated the use of tools such as NVivo, Atlas.ti, and MaxQDA to facilitate efficient data coding and categorization. The training emphasized the importance of data triangulation, validity, and reliability in textual analysis. He also highlighted the significance of using theoretical frameworks and conceptual models to guide the analysis. By providing hands-on experience with these tools and methods, he equipped the researchers with the skills to conduct a comprehensive and rigorous textual analysis for their research projects.

Dr. Sandeep Sitaram Ghugre, Ghugre, Centre-Director, Kolkata Centre, UGC-DAE Consortium for Scientific Research Sector 3, Kolkata, West Bengal; **(2:30PM-3:30Pm)**, Research involves a systematic approach to gain deeper insights into the universe and its components. It includes dedicated efforts to discover new knowledge or refine existing knowledge. The process is likened to Robert Frost's poem "The Road Not Taken," where choosing less-travelled paths leads to unique discoveries. Researchers in basic science aim to understand why and how things function, often leading to technological advancements and applications. They explore fundamental questions about the nature of reality, laying the groundwork for applied sciences.

Dr. Raghu Echempati, Echempati, Professor, Wayne State University; Retired professor, Kettering University; Emeritus Professor, The ICFAI University Tripura; **(3.40 PM - 4.40 PM)**. He delivered a comprehensive lecture on the objectives and goals of research methodology in Science & Technology. He highlighted how research and development activities contribute to innovation, driving technological advancements and improving the quality of life. He explained how technology transfer enables the dissemination of new knowledge, products, and services, ultimately enhancing the researcher's expertise and reputation. He emphasized that effective research methodology is crucial for achieving these goals, ensuring that research is rigorous, relevant, and reproducible. His engaging presentation instilled in students the importance of research methodology in driving innovation and technological progress.

Dr. Dipayan Chattopadhyay, Assistant Professor, Department of Physics, The ICFAI University Tripura. Discussed; **(4:50PM-5:50PM)**, how to incorporate AI and Machine Learning into research endeavours by mentioning the different types of machine learning and its broad categories. The key take ways from the session understood AI and its fundamental principles. It also highlighted real-world examples of how machine learning and AI are transforming research across different domains. The hand-on-hand sessions equipped participants with practical skills. The interactive nature of the workshop encouraged collaboration among participants. This facilitated the exchange of ideas and fostered potential research collaborations.

Dr. Prasenjit Bal, Assistant Professor, Department of Mathematics, The ICFAI University Tripura, **(4:50PM-5:50PM)**, explained the numerous advantages of using Latex for thesis writing, installing Latex allows for professional-quality typesetting with efficient crossreferencing and an extensive package library. This free and open-source software is available for Windows, MacOS, and Linux, providing superior mathematical typesetting. With a Latex distribution and editor, researchers can produce high-quality documents with ease, making it an essential tool for academics and professionals. During the presentation the speaker provided a live demonstration of latex. Participants engaged actively, asking questions and seeking clarifications. The session concluded with a Q&A segment, where the spoke person addressed specific queries and provided additional guidance.

Day 5: Common Sessions

Dr. Alessandro Vescovi, Associate Professor, Università degli Studi di Milano (The University of Milan, Italy), **(2:00PM-3:00PM)**, emphasized that evaluating the quality of a dissertation or monograph is a complex process, often performed by academics and peers. Spontaneous evaluation by the academic community can be influenced by various factors, leading to varying opinions on the quality of the work. This can be attributed to differences in evaluators' expertise, research interests, and cultural backgrounds. To mitigate this issue, suggested using shifting parameters to evaluate different aspects of the dissertation. This approach allows evaluators to focus on specific criteria, such as methodology, originality, and significance, rather than overall quality. However, even with shifting parameters, planned evaluation of a large body of work can still lead to diverse opinions among evaluators. As a

result, it is crucial for evaluators to provide constructive feedback and justify their ratings, enabling the author to understand the strengths and weaknesses of their work.

Dr Vijayakumar Mallappa, Librarian, Pondicherry University, Puducherry, **(3:10PM5:10PM)**, discussed the various tools and apps used in academic research, highlighting their procedures and applications. He mentioned Scisummary, Parrot, and Wortune as effective tools for summarizing and analyzing research articles. Julius was introduced as a tool for citation management, while Knowledge Map was emphasized for visualizing research skills. Gamma was presented as a medium for presenting research findings in an engaging manner. Participants' questions revealed a desire for more information on these tools, prompting to elaborate on their benefits and limitations, providing a comprehensive overview of the various tools available for researchers.
